



# How to become a **further education teacher**

# How to become a further education teacher

To become a further education teacher in Ireland, there are **two options** to choose from:

**The first option** is to complete a Level 8 degree on the NFQ which has an ECTS credit weighing of at least 180 ECTS credits.

**OR**

Complete a Level 7 degree on the NFQ which has an ECTS credit weighing of at least 180 ECTS, and provide evidence of either:

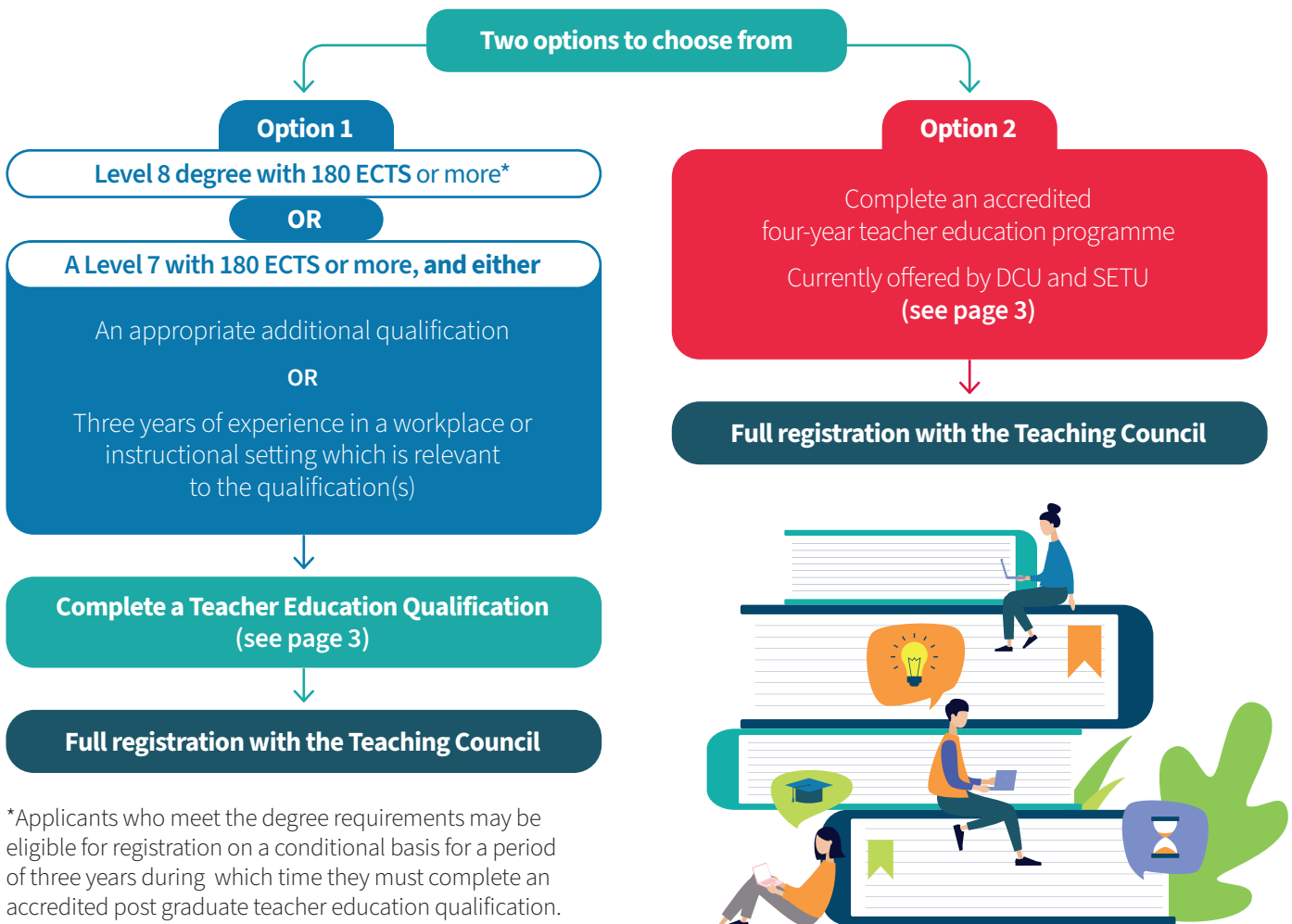
- i. An appropriate additional qualification, **OR**
- ii. A minimum of three years of experience in a workplace or instructional setting which is relevant to your qualification.

You must then complete one of the accredited Further Education teacher education qualifications listed on page 3.

\*Applicants who meet the degree requirements may be eligible for registration on a conditional basis for a period of three years during which time they must complete an accredited post graduate teacher education qualification.

**The second option** is to complete a four-year teacher education qualification in Further Education, which is accredited by the Teaching Council. These degrees are currently offered by DCU and SETU and are listed on page 3.
