



Khadija is a Senior Lecturer and a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy in the School of Education and Social Sciences in the UK. Her PhD centres on race equality exploring the lived experiences of Black and Minority Ethnic teachers in Scotland. Khadija received the Scottish Trade Union Congress Equality Award in 2019 and is the first BAME Muslim educator to be elected as the Vice-Convenor of the General Teaching Council for Scotland (GTCS).




On 11 June, Dennis Shirley and Andy will release the book
