In order to meet the registration requirements set down in the Teaching Council [Registration] Regulations in respect of the curricular subject of French, **all** of the following criteria must be met:

- 1**
 - (a) French must be studied in the degree up to and including third-year level or higher (or modular equivalent).
 - (b) The qualifying degree must be equivalent to at least Level 8 on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ) and with a minimum pass result in all examinations pertinent to the subject of French.
 - (c) The qualifying degree must carry at least 180 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) credits (or equivalent) with the specific study of French comprising at least 60 ECTS credits (or equivalent).

- 2** The study of French during the qualification must show that the holder has acquired sufficient knowledge, skills and understanding to teach the French language syllabus/specification to the highest level in post-primary education (see www.curriculumonline.ie).

- 3 Evidence of linguistic competence**
 - a) All graduates must provide evidence of linguistic competence in the language. This can be demonstrated by providing evidence of achieving a minimum level of B2.2 on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (or equivalent) from the higher education institution where the qualification was completed.
 - b) Alternatively, graduates can provide certification of achieving level B2.2 standard of an independent language competency test.

- 4 The degree must also include the study of the following:**
 - language skills¹
 - the study of texts²

- 5** Prior to completion of their teacher education studies, graduates should provide verifiable evidence of an immersive educational experience in French of a minimum of four weeks duration.
This may be accessed in two blocks, each of which must be at least two weeks. At least one of these blocks must be in a setting where the language is the vernacular language of the region/country.
The immersive educational experience(s) must be one of the following:
 - attending a language course
 - working as a staff member in an educational setting
 - conducting an action research project which is of relevance to their teaching studies
 - engaging in School Placement.
